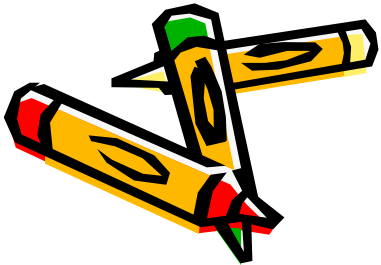
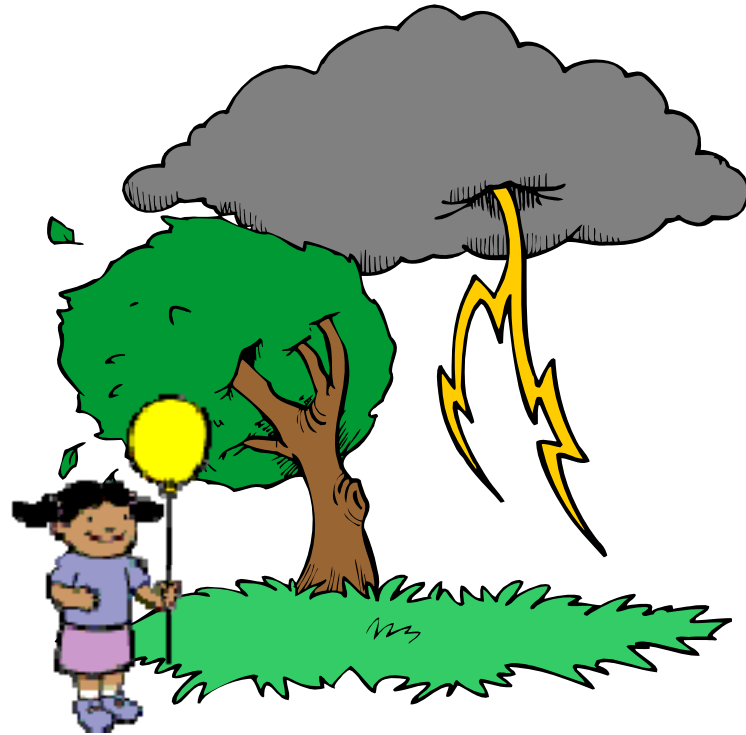

# Types of Camp Emergency: *What will you do?*

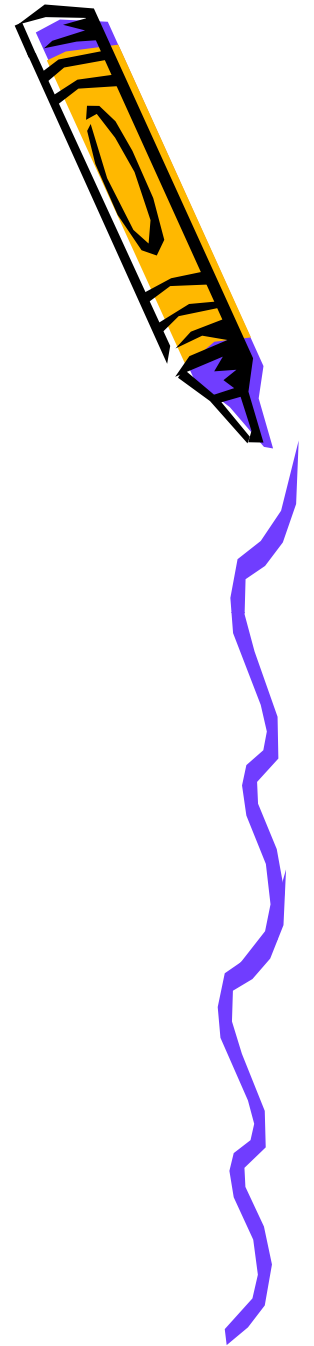


- Intruder

- Camp Tradition Risks



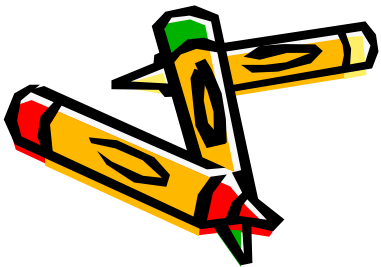
# What you do!

- Assess the situation
  - Who is involved
  - Severity
  - Location, time, etc.



# Emergency Plan, con't

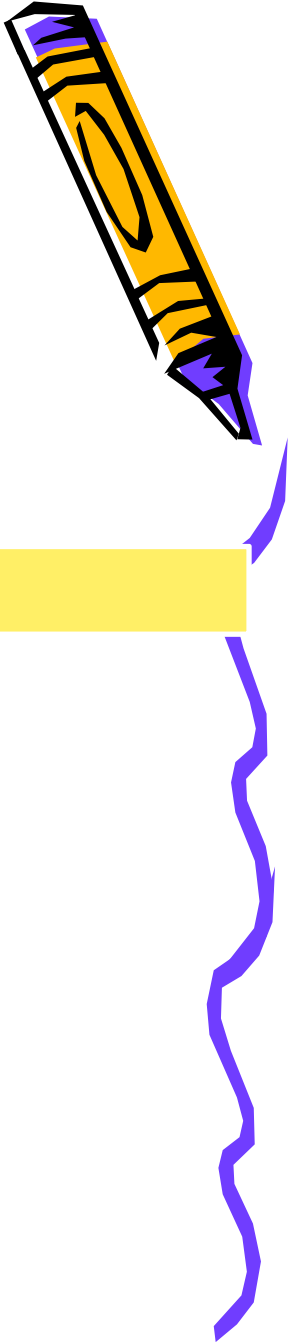
- Call for help
